Solano Community College student receives first Suisun Valley Vintners and Growers Association Maurice J. Koch Scholarship. First of two annual scholarships awarded to SCC student seeking a career in agriculture.

Fairfield, California (Friday, October 21, 2016)— The Suisun Valley Vintners and Growers Association (SVVGA) and the Solano Community College (SCC) Educational Foundation have an agreement in place to support SCC students seeking a career in agriculture. The first student to receive the SVVGA Maurice J. Koch Memorial Scholarship is Sean Adams, an SCC student taking 18.5 credit hours this semester. Mr. Adams will receive a two-year scholarship in the amount of \$1,500 per year (\$3,000 total).

The purpose of the SVVGA scholarships is to encourage students from within Solano County to pursue an education in agriculture and viticulture. Each year, for a total of five years, one SCC freshman student will be awarded a scholarship. SVVGA will make annual contributions to the SCC Educational Foundation in the total amount of \$15,000. The scholarship recipient must be enrolled as a full-time SCC student and want to pursue a career in agriculture, such as farming or ranching, or in the viticulture and wine production industry. The recipient must reside in Solano County, or have graduated from high school in Solano County.

Roger King, President of SVVGA, stated "Awarding the first scholarship is a milestone that the Suisun Valley Vintners and Growers Association Board of Directors has been looking forward to. It is our honest hope that young individuals in Solano County will give agriculture full consideration as a viable career; it has been the historic backbone of Solano County. The naming of the scholarship is our way of recognizing the tremendous contributions of Maurry Koch. In addition, we're planning our first Suisun Valley Wine Auction next month. A portion of the proceeds from this event will help fund the scholarship program."

The Suisun Valley Wine Auction will be held Saturday Nov 5th in the barrel room at Wooden Valley Winery. Dinner is being prepared by Peter Halikas at Mankas Steakhouse. Auction lots have been developed by the SVVGA Board of Directors. Each lot will include a specialty experience from vineyard dinners to ski trips with a winemaker. SVVGA hopes to attract a base of Solano County business and professional leaders who understand the value of higher education and will help support the scholarship program.

Curt Johnston added "Supporting full time students will help them complete an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree in two years, and hopefully transfer to one of the great four-year institutions in California with a strong agriculture degree program. It's been a pleasure to work with Roger King and the SVVGA Board to help them accomplish their goal of supporting SCC students seeking a career in agriculture."
